Most of these idioms refer to acts of working with others—collaboration. Often many individuals, groups, organizations, governments, and states have united

And so it is this year with the **SIEC-ISBE Vienna-2022** Conference, for which we are creating a program in conjunction with SIEC Austria and the Institute of Business Education at Vienna University of Economics and Business with Austrian educators and keynote speakers, on the topic "The Economy of the Future". Many of the presentations, workshops, panel members, and individuals are working with others to present their findings in research or share their successes in educational practicum.

Many of these presentations have been collaboratively researched, developed, and will be presented with others. With collaboration still in mind, we know that these people are willing to share their findings and work, and answer your questions as these relate to their findings and practices. Join us as we journey together, share our learning and work, and gain from each other—at SIEC-ISBE Vienna-2022 together with SIEC Austria and the Institute of Business Education at Vienna University of Economics and Business in a collaboration collage of "The Economy of the Future".

### Using digital technology in business education: Enlivening the teaching and learning process

A business education teacher needs to cultivate a classroom atmosphere conducive to learning. S/he needs to 'catch' the students' interest. Such interest needs to be sustained. It is the 'hold' factors of meaningfulness and relevance that sustain the students' motivation (Dewey, 2008). The expert teacher's skill is in finding materials or activities that can do both (Stobart, 2014). The following are ideas relating to the use of digital technology that can help to catch and hold the students' attention.

- Websites such as <a href="https://learningapps.org/">https://wordwall.net/</a> assist to set up different activities that assist to engage the students with the knowledge involved. Figure 1 illustrates the activities that can be devised from <a href="https://wordwall.net/">https://wordwall.net/</a>
- Organising online board games such as by using <a href="https://learnhip.com/">https://learnhip.com/</a>. These games can be used, for instance, to help the students practise the posting of accounting transactions.
- Employing stories that make use of the 'teacher's passion', that is, the effective manner in which a teacher recounts stories.
  - https://www.storyboardthat.com/storyboard-creator can help create comic strips that can assist the process of storytelling.
- Websites such as <a href="https://quizizz.com/">https://take.</a>

   <a href="quiz-maker.com/">quiz-maker.com/</a> and <a href="https://kahoot.com/">https://kahoot.com/</a> can help to set up a quiz that engages the students with the disciplinary knowledge involved. For instance, celebrating what has been learned during the lesson at the conclusion stage.
- The website <a href="https://pickerwheel.com/">https://pickerwheel.com/</a> provides a random wheel that can be adjusted to choose students, topics, ...
- Online tools such as through <a href="https://www.strikingly.com/">https://www.strikingly.com/</a>

that help to develop a website/blog that includes the material and the resources related to the topics covered.

- Students tend to be hooked much better when we use videos from TikTok application, such as from https://twitter.com/Humphreytalks. For example, when discussing economies of scale the teacher can make use of a video that illustrates the disadvantages suffered by a business when it increases in size.
- Create simple videos through such websites as https://www.animaker.com/
- Employing charade cards. For example, some students are chosen at random and are given one type of employment interview which they need to act out or explain without saying particular words and which the class needs to guess.

As business education teachers we are invited to explore and creatively employ digital technology that helps us to enact pedagogical content representations (Shulman, 1986, 1987) that engage our students with the substantive knowledge involved and that bring the business education subjects that we teach to life.



To submit a manuscript to the journal, you will use the Submit Article link on our home page.

The submission process consists of the following steps:

Read and accept the Article Submission Agreement Provide information about yourself Provide information about any authors Upload your article and related items

Before you begin, please be sure you have the following items:

**Article Title** 

An abstract (separate from the article body)

Keywords for your article (optional)

Article in one of the following formats: Microsoft Word, or RTF.

Articles must be submitted without a title page, abstract, or page numbers. These will be provided by the system.
