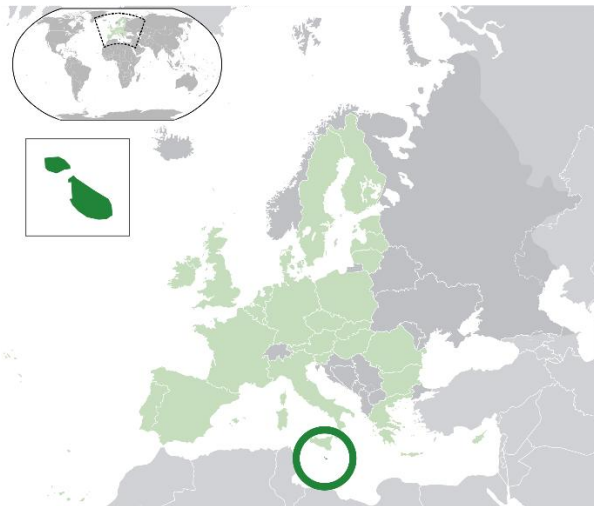

Information about Malta





- Malta International Airport (MLA) is the only airport in Malta.
- Public transport routes are available all over Malta. The main bus terminus is located in Valletta, situated about 10 minutes walk away from the Valletta Campus. For more information, refer to the official page: <https://www.publictransport.com.mt/>
- Another form of transport is by car, including Uber, eCabs, Bolt, or booking a taxi through the Taxi Stand at the airport.
- A ferry also operates from and to Sliema and Valletta, and between Valletta and the Three Cities. More info about this service may be obtained from the official website: <https://vallettaferryservices.com/>
- The average high temperature in Malta in July is 32°C.
- The currency in Malta is the Euro.
- The electricity supply is 220/240 volts, single phase, 50 cycle. Square-fitting standard three-pin plugs and sockets are used.
- Malta has two official languages: Maltese and English. English is widely spoken in Malta.
- Restaurants in Malta offer a wide choice of cuisine, ranging from local to Continental, Indian, Mexican, and Chinese.
- Malta has two official languages: Maltese and English. English is widely spoken in Malta.
- Shops are usually open from 09:00 to 13:00 and 16:00 to 19:00. However, many are closed on Saturday afternoons, while one can shop in the shopping malls all day and on Sundays. Malta is renowned for its lace, Mdina Glass, and reasonably priced gold and silver items. Local honey and wine have been famous since antiquity.
